

PTE Academic, administered by Pearson, is a computer-based English language proficiency test designed for non-native English speakers who wish to study abroad or immigrate. The test results are typically available within five business days. The PTE Academic score is widely accepted by institutions and governments worldwide, including countries such as Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the UK, and the USA. Notable universities like Harvard, Yale, and INSEAD recognize PTE Academic scores, and the Australian government accepts it for visa applications. Additionally, ministries of education and employers also acknowledge it as proof of English language proficiency.

## PTE Academic Syllabus and Exam Pattern:

The PTE Academic exam assesses English language proficiency and does not require specific knowledge in other subjects. The test duration is three hours and consists of three main parts: Speaking and Writing (merged), Listening, and Reading. There are twenty different question formats, ranging from multiple choice questions to essay writing and information interpretation.

1. Speaking and Writing:

- This section assesses the ability to speak and write in English.
- Tasks may include summarizing written text, essay writing, and responding to questions.


## 2. Listening:

- The Listening section evaluates the ability to understand spoken English.
- Candidates may encounter a variety of accents, including British, American, and non-native speakers.
- Tasks involve summarizing spoken text, multiple choice questions, and filling in the blanks based on audio prompts.


## 3. Reading:

- The Reading section assesses the ability to comprehend written English.
- Tasks include multiple choice questions, re-ordering paragraphs, and filling in the blanks based on written prompts.
- Excerpts from lectures may include different accents, and graphical data like pie charts and graphs
may be presented.


## Result and Recognition:

- PTE Academic scores are typically available within five business days.
- Recognized by various universities, governments, ministries of education, and employers as proof of English proficiency.
